## **Voters Re-Elect Billera and Miller to North Metro Fire Board of Directors**

**Northglenn/Broomfield, CO** – North Metro Fire Rescue District election polls closed at 7 p.m. on May 3, 2022. From the votes tallied, the unofficial results show that District residents have re-elected Peter Billera and Richard Miller to serve a three-year term on the North Metro Fire Board of Directors.

Both Billera and Miller have served on North Metro Fire's board since 2018, with Miller presiding as board president and Billera as vice president. Billera is an entrepreneur and former firefighter who resides in Broomfield with his family. Miller is retired from a career in law enforcement and also worked for the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. He and his wife have been residents of Broomfield since 2006.

Voters were allowed to vote for two candidates on their election ballot. The election results were as follows:

The results will be officially confirmed on May 11, once the eight-day window closes for absentee ballots to be received from uniformed and overseas citizens. The elected directors will begin serving their term after taking their oath of office at North Metro Fire's upcoming board meeting on May 17, beginning at 4 p.m. at District Headquarters, 101 Spader Way, Broomfield.

"Each board election we've had more residents seeking a position on the board than we've had openings, which demonstrates the engaged community we live and work in," said North Metro Fire Chief David

Ramos. "We are fortunate to have residents interested in serving on our board and helping guide our fire district to be one of the best in the metro area."
