Car Crashes Into Business on Lowell Blvd. in Broomfield

No major injuries reported; Driver transported for evaluation

Broomfield, CO — North Metro Fire Rescue District and Broomfield Police responded to a call that came in around 8:30 a.m. of a car that had crashed into a business at 12716 Lowell Blvd. in Broomfield. Despite the damage that occurred to the exercise facility, no major injuries resulted from the crash.

One of the employees was pinned to a wall inside as a result of the crash but was soon rescued by North Metro Fire crews and treated on scene for minor injuries. That individual is expected to be okay. The driver of the four-door sedan was able to crawl out of the vehicle and was transported for further evaluation. Approximately five to seven clients and employees were inside the building when the crash occurred, but no other injuries were reported.

Broomfield Police is continuing to investigate the cause of the accident.
